Bruce Gibb Grants Chairman Report

Since last year's subcommittee report, P&KSC has seen an increase in Club Grants awarded 66% and a decrease in Individual Grants awarded 33%

Equipment, development, and events grants are now under the banner of Club grants and are eligible to apply for grants up to a maximum of £400 and personal development grants are applications of up to £200. This lowering of the limits will allow the money we are granted to go further across Perth and Kinross but still with the purpose of enabling athletes and clubs attain higher standards and assist them with travel expenses to participate in higher level competition.

We would not be able to do this without the continued support of Perth and Kinross Council to whom we are eternally grateful as well as Live Active Leisure for their administrative help and assistance over the year. We will continue to support our athletes and clubs in Perth and Kinross provided we have funding in place.
